Job title: GP SPIN Fellowship (0.2fte)

Main purpose of the job:

In partnership with Health Education England (HEE), the University of Roehampton invites applications for a General Practitioner (GP) SPIN Fellowship. The Salaried Portfolio Innovation Scheme (SPIN) is a HEE initiative to promote portfolio roles and support the recruitment and retention of newly qualified GPs in primary care. The successful GP SPIN Fellow will work alongside the nurse education team in delivering high-quality primary care education.

As part of your role development as a new GP, you will have a keen interest in education and in sharing your knowledge and skills with the future healthcare workforce. This role offers GP SPIN Fellows the opportunity to develop a portfolio in education and consider future pathways such as a clinical academic career. You will contribute to the development and delivery of pre- and post-registration nursing and allied healthcare practitioner education at undergraduate and post-graduate levels. You will contribute to learning, teaching and assessment in the classroom, in practice and the Clinical Simulation Centres. You will also help provide academic and pastoral guidance to students and apprentices in the University and support to students, supervisors and assessors in clinical practice.

You will work collaboratively with the nursing education team and other colleagues across the School of Life and Health Sciences and also students, apprentices, stakeholders, service users and carers and the wider university. You will act as a professional role model at all times and uphold your professional body standards. You will also have the opportunity to contribute to the development and profile of healthcare education at the University through engagement with relevant professional practice and scholarly activity. SPIN Fellows will have the opportunity to complete Associate HEA Fellowship through Advance HE. The exact nature of the Fellowship will be tailored to the needs of the programme and to the interests/skills of the Fellow.

Main duties and responsibilities:

- contributing to undergraduate, postgraduate teaching and related duties including the supervision of students
- supporting the nursing education team to deliver primary care teaching
- contributing to clinical placement expansion activity
- contributing to curriculum development and review
- contributing to research, knowledge exchange and enterprise activities, where appropriate

- contributing to quality assurance and enhancement of all activities
- undertaking any other appropriate duties as requested by the Dean of School
